1) 11/12 2) 0—10 3) 13+

From which you can tell that I think you should know from South's *second* call whether they have bid (i) normal stayman (ii) weak stayman (iii) extended stayman

4) 2C ie initiating a weak stayman sequence

5) 3H ie North answers Souths extended stayman sequence

6) (i)	1NT----- 2C	(ii)	1NT-----2C
	2H -----Pass		2D-----3D
			3S-----4S

7) Jump with the Ace spades.

Then lead a suit that partner will win so she can return a diamond for you to ruff.
Sounds easy.

Try leading the Ace hearts –perhaps she will play high and you can carry on with hearts. If there is a negative signal on the Ace hearts you will have to lead a low club and hope for the best.

8) Play the 9. NOT the 10 btw

9)(i) play low on the diamond lead; if it is continued play low again

(ii) win Ace diamonds -play Ace clubs ----play K clubs –play Q clubs (discarding a heart NB NOT a diamond) –draw trumps.
