Answers -distributional discards

1) partner almost certainly has three diamonds (they started with the 4 diamonds).

(I know they havent two diamonds because their 4 was the lowest card available to them).

So it seems declarer has two diamonds.

I will duck the first round and win the second.

- 2) well we have our job to do too (they also serve etc etc). We play the 4. And obviously follow with the 2. Showing partner that we have a doubleton may assist them to defend the hand. (They may have the Ace diamonds for instance and want to hold it up)
- 3) Well we petered in diamonds (that means played a high low). Partner may get in with a high trump perhaps and give us a ruff in diamonds
- 4) 4NT. Quantitative
- 4)b) 4NT quantitative
- 5) Win and lead small to the 9. Next time you have the lead in dummy lead small to the J
- 6) west has specifically Hearts and clubs (and opening points)
- 7) East has repeated their takeout double. They must be quite strong to keep insisting we call.
- 8) (i) 2NT [10-12]
 - ii) 3NT
 - 8) (a) opener is requested to go 6NT with 14 (or 13 if they want)–with less stop in 4NT
 - 9) (b) a) opener is requested to go 7NT with 14 (or 13 if they want) –with less go to 6NT
